GARDEN BLOOMS

CLASS

1. A coloured photo that shows your garden's composition - the structures, tones, textures and colours of its plants. The part of the garden shown should be 5 metres frontage or less. The photo should be 8 x 6 inches or 20 x 15 cms in size and printed onto an A4 size piece of paper. You can give your garden a name ('My Peaceful Place' or 'The Jungle', for example.) The name should be written on the A4 piece of paper and must not identify you.
2. Pansies, three distinct with collars
3. Stock, three distinct, no laterals
4. Sweet peas, six distinct
5. Geranium, one double
6. Geranium, one single
7. Geranium, ivy, two distinct
8. Flowering climber/creeper, one distinct
9. Iris, one cut
10. Daffodil, one cut
11. Orchid, one cut
12. Bulb, one flowering
13. Native floral bloom, one cut
14. Flower, not otherwise mentioned
15. Flowering shrub, one cut with foliage, can be a native
16. Flowering shrubs, cut, three distinct, can be native, in individual jars

- ◆ VASE: Container to be taller than its width
- ◆ BOWL: Container to be less than its width
- ◆ POT: Container to be approximately round in both opening and general shape.
- ◆ Arrangements in classes 17-27 should be displayed in a vase, bowl or pot.

CLASS:

17. Arrangement of Perennials
18. Arrangement of Nasturtiums, own foliage
19. Arrangement of Sweet Peas
20. Arrangement of one flower, with own or other foliage
21. Arrangement of five assorted flowers, with own or other foliage
22. Arrangement of cut foliage, includes native foliage
23. Arranged trough of assorted or same flowers, facing one way, includes native flowers
24. Arrangement of flowers of one colour, may be more than one shade of that colour
25. Arrangement of cereal crop, may be more than one variety
26. Arrangement representing song title, named
- 27. Arrangement representing the show's theme of Recycling**
28. Everlasting Arrangement (Posey) – a small arrangement of dried and/or preserved flowers and foliage suitable for an event
29. Everlasting Arrangement (Bouquet) – a large arrangement of dried and/or preserved flowers and foliage suitable for an event

- ◆ They must be clean with no labels visible.
- ◆ Pot plants must have been grown in pots for not less than two months and belong to exhibitor

30. Pot Plant in bloom, not bulb or orchid, one plant only
31. Pot Plant in bloom, bulb, bulbs or orchid
32. Pot Plant of ferns or foliage, any kind
33. Pot of Cacti
34. Pot of Succulents
35. Geranium, single
36. Geranium, double
37. Indoor pot plant
38. Plant in Novel Container
39. Miniature Garden
40. Cacti/Succulents, group of three containers no larger than 10cms across at top
41. Hanging basket or container, in flower
42. Hanging basket or container, for foliage
43. Hanging basket or container of varied succulents
44. Kokedama plant, flowering
45. Kokedama plant, foliage
46. **Rescue, Recycle, and Remake! Make a pot for plants reusing unusual items**
