Class 217 Geranium, ivy, two distinct

Class 218 Flowering climber/creeper, one distinct

Class 219 Iris, one cut

Class 220 Daffodil, one cut

Class 221 Orchid, one cut

Class 222 Bulb, one flowering

Class 223 Native floral bloom, one cut

Class 224 Flower, not otherwise mentioned

Class 225 Flowering shrub, one cut with foliage, can be a native

Class 226 Flowering shrubs, cut, three distinct, can be native in individual jars (can be the same species)

- VASE: Container to be taller than its width
- BOWL: Container to be less than its width
- POT: Container to be round or square

- Arrangements in classes 227-239 and 606 should be displayed in a vase, bowl or pot
- All exhibits must be grown by exhibitor except classes 236 to 239 and 606

Class 227 Arrangement of Perennials

Class 228 Arrangement of Nasturtiums, own foliage

Class 229 Arrangement of Sweet Peas

Class 230 Arrangement of one flower, with own or other foliage

Class 231 Arrangement of five assorted flowers, with own or other foliage

Class 232 Arrangement of cut foliage, includes native foliage

Class 233 Arranged trough of assorted or same flowers, facing one way, includes native flowers

Class 234 Arrangement of flowers of one colour, may be more than one shade of that colour

Class 235 Arrangement of cereal crop, may be more than one variety

Class 236 Arrangement representing song title, named

Class 237 Arrangement representing the show's theme of Neon, all things glowing!

Class 238 Dried Arrangement - a small arrangement of dried and/or preserved flowers and foliage suitable for an event

Class 239 Dried Arrangement - a large arrangement of dried and/or preserved flowers and foliage suitable for an event

Class 606 Arrangement of fresh flowers

- POTS/CONTAINERS: any shape, no more than about 32cms in diameter at the top.
- Terrarium: Must be able to be carried by one person.
- They must be clean with no labels visible.
- Pot plants must have been grown in pots for not less than two months and belong to exhibitor

Class 240 Pot Plant in bloom, not bulb or orchid, one plant only

Class 241 Pot Plant in bloom, bulb, bulbs or orchid

Class 242 Pot Plant of ferns or foliage, any kind

Class 243 Pot of Cacti

Class 244 Pot of Succulents

Class 245 Pot of Flowering Succulents

Class 246 Geranium, single

Class 247 Geranium, double

Class 248 Indoor pot plant

Class 249 Plant in Novel Container

Class 250 Miniature Garden

Class 251 Cacti/Succulents, group of three containers

no larger than 10cms across at top

Class 252 Hanging basket or container, in flower

Class 253 Hanging basket or container, for foliage

Class 254 Hanging basket or container of varied succulents

Class 255 Kokedama plant, flowering

Class 256 Kokedama plant, foliage

Class 257 Neon, all things glowing! Make a pot for plants using unusual items

NB: Pot plants for Class 257 do not have to been grown for two months but must belong to exhibitor.
